The establishment of this college was done by Brigadier Ran Singh in 1969 with the name Haryana Mahavidyalya Beri Dujana. In 1982 this Mahavidyalya (college) was taken over by the Govt. and it was named as Govt. College Dujana. As per the orders of the Govt. of Haryana, on 27<sup>th</sup> July 1994, it was given the name Brig. Ran Singh Govt College, Dujana. The college is affiliated with M.D.University Rohtak.

## Bachelor of Arts (B.A.)
